## **Former San Diego Charger and Los Angeles Dodger to be Keynote Athletes at Mentoring Today for Tomorrow's 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Youth Sports Camp**

*Murrieta, California* – On May 16, when one hundred low-income, at-risk, and underserved youth from the Murrieta, Temecula, Hemet, and Perris communities gather for Mentoring Today for Tomorrow's 2009 Sports Camp, they will get more than a lesson in speed and quickness or help perfecting their curveballs: they'll get the expertise and personal experiences of two professional athletes with a proven track record for doing their part to help youth succeed.

A former San Diego Charger wide receiver, Mark Seay is famous among NFL fans for catching the winning TD pass in the January 1995 playoff game against the Miami Dolphins. But off the field, as a community representative for Stater Bros., Seay is known for his regional appearances to influence youth and communities by sharing his gripping story of achieving success despite personal hardship.

Rudy Law is no stranger to sports fans, either. Known as one of the fastest players in baseball, Law was an outfielder in the Major Leagues for seven seasons, setting a 1980 Dodgers rookie record for batting .260 with 40 steals in a single season and a White Sox single-season record with 77 steals in 1983.

"We are excited to work with Mr. Seay and Mr. Law for this year's Sports Camp," said Eva Johnson, founder of Mentoring Today for Tomorrow Inc. "Every year we look for the best professional athletes with great histories of caring for and working with youth, and this year our kids are in for a real treat."

The Sports Camp will be held on Saturday, May 16, from 9:00am – 1:00pm at Park Avenue Elementary School in Perris, CA. The event is open to all youths aged 8-18, and registration is \$20. In addition to specialized sports and health training, participants will receive sports bags with footballs, baseballs, sports caps, and other goodies donated by the organization's community partners.
